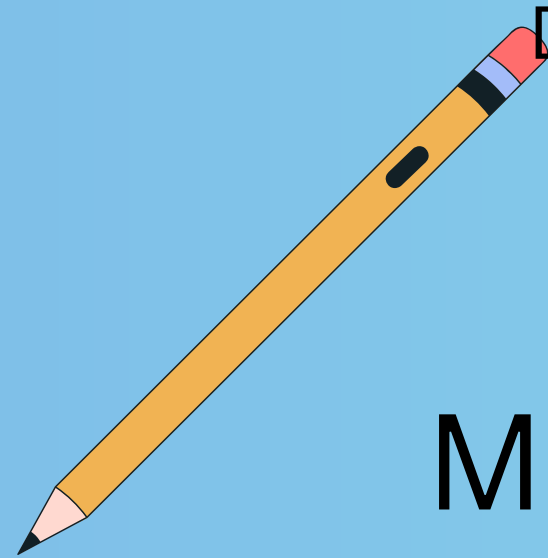

Reading and writing:

Children will explore The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe and learn how characters can change over time, while developing prediction skills using evidence from the text. They will create a range of writing, including a poem, an imagined conversation, and writing in role, supported by regular grammar and spelling activities. Drama techniques such as hot-seating and thought-tapping will help deepen understanding and support their writing development.

History

In history, children will explore the local area and learn about the castle, including why it is important. They will study the castle in detail, including its history as a hunting lodge for the king. Children will also investigate other events that have taken place nearby and how the area has changed over time.



Maths

This term in maths, children will learn about shape, time, statistics and directions through practical and engaging activities. They will look at and compare angles, draw and identify shapes, and translate shapes on grids. Children will also collect data and present it in a range of graphs to support their understanding of statistics.

Science

In science, children will learn about the properties of materials, including their physical and chemical characteristics. They will investigate thermal conductors and insulators, explore how materials are used (such as in building and elasticity), and carry out a range of practical investigations. Children will also consider how safe different materials are, including understanding toxicity and flammability.

In PSHE, children will explore breaking down barriers, the importance of coming home on time, and basic first aid. In first aid, they will learn to identify situations that may require help and understand reasons why someone might struggle to breathe. They will also recognise the signs of an asthma attack or choking so they know when to seek support.

R&WV

Pupils will explore how religion and belief have shaped the local area. They will examine global, national and local data, including census information, to understand how beliefs vary and influence communities. Children will use this evidence to investigate their local area in more detail and present their findings.
